Puckerbrush is a celebration of traditional archery, bushcraft, art, survival, outdoors, and ancestral skills. It is an opportunity for people with a diverse range of backgrounds and a shared interest in an older, simpler way of doing things to gather, both sharing and learning skills. This is very much a “hands on” event, kids of all ages are encouraged to get their hands dirty and have fun! While instruction is a big part of the event, just as importantly we encourage interaction between all attendees with a goal of growing the skills based community.

- 1. Cost-** General admission is \$25.00 for the weekend with free camping included. Day passes are \$5.00 for Friday afternoon, \$15.00 for Saturday, \$10.00 for Sunday. Youth 12 and under free.
 - 2. Hours-** The grounds will open at 12:00 Friday for campers. Events will be scheduled Friday 12:00 - 5:00 pm, Saturday 9:00 am - 9:00 pm, and Sunday 9:00 am - 3:00 pm. Please inquire about pre and post event set up/ break down times.
 - 3. Ranges-** The facility will be closed for firearms use Friday through Sunday.
 - 4. Camping-** Free primitive camping is available on site. We have sanitary facilities, but enforce a strict carry in/carry out policy on trash.
 - 5. Pets-** We welcome friendly, well behaved dogs. Dogs are to be kept under the immediate control of their owners and held on a leash no less than six feet in length. Owners are responsible for providing their own shade and picking up after their animals.
 - 6. Alcohol-** This is a kid/family friendly chem free event. Alcohol and all other intoxicants are forbidden.
 - 7. Food-** There will be a staffed kitchen selling meals, snacks, and beverages during event hours.
 - 8. Fire-** Fire rings will be available for use in approved areas, firewood will be available.
 - 9. Children-** All children are to be supervised by an adult at all times.
 - 10. Presenters-** may be eligible for free admission. Please contact us for more information.
- Directions:** From US 1 in Columbia Falls, Maine, following signage go north on Epping Rd., travel 2 ¼ miles to Meetinghouse Rd., turn right and travel ½ mile, and turn right on Tibbetstown Rd. immediately after crossing the bridge. Turn right at first driveway, 1597 Tibbetstown Rd., red building will be visible on top of the hill.
